Selected highlights include a monumental matched pair of mushroom lamps

in the full Harvard cut pattern (each one 23 inches by 14 inches); an 8-inch Straus cranberry-to-clear ball-shaped water pitcher in the Wales pattern by Clark; and a rare 8-inch signed Hawkes panel pattern low bowl with outstanding blank, coloring and cutting.

ABCG vases will feature a 12-inch, four-footed, two-handled oval vase with hobstar, strawberry, diamond, star and fan motif, sporting triple-notched handles; a 16inch tulip-shaped vase with large hobstar columns with notching highlights and a huge faceted cut knob stem; and an exceedingly rare 12-inch bowling pin-shaped vase in the Columbia pattern by Blackmer.

Expected stars of the bowls category include a 4-inch by 5-inch rose bowl in the Wheat pattern by J. Hoare; a squareshaped bowl in the Chicago pattern by Fry; and

a signed Hawkes rolled rim bowl in the Queens pattern, with great blank and cutting. Also sold will be a squat-shaped water pitcher in the Niagara pattern with triple notched handle and

long spout. Also offered will be a 10inch corset-shaped cookie jar with complete hobstar, nailhead diamond and lattice design, pattern cut lid and a large hobstar base; and a rare 5-inch pedestal plantationsize creamer and sugar with a

Copley assembled several significant collections containing outstanding decoy and decorative bird carvings. Among the most important decoys offered is a Charles Birch (1867-1956) swan (\$90,000-\$120,000) – one of the finest swan decoys to exist.

Copley will offer numerous works by East Harwich maker A. E. Crowell (1862-1952), including a complete set of 25 miniature waterfowl (\$100,000-

In addition to the diverse selection of more than 70 miniatures, several full size birds are offered, including two outstanding decorative shorebirds, a preening greater yellowlegs (\$40,000-\$60,000) and a preening curlew (\$60,000-\$90,000). In part two of the sale a stately oil of moose by Carl Clemens Moritz Rungius (1869-1959) titled "In the Cedar Swamp" is expected

to earn \$150,000-\$250,000. "Waiting for its Master" (\$100,000-\$200,000;
